FIRE 1033 Fire Officer Leadership

Catalog Description

This course provides the participant with basic skills and tools needed to perform effectively in the firefighter service environment. Topics of discussion will include firefighter benefits, unions, group dynamics, communication, problem solving, and other personnel matters. This course will enable mid-range managers, especially company officers, to be more effective in their roles as leaders.

Forms of Assessment
