MATH 2053 Finite if taking BUTR 1033 Data Analysis and Interpretation [STAT 2503]; for social sciences-must take PSYC 2003 General Psychology [PSYC 1163] and SOC 2013 General Sociology [SOCI 2753].
- 2. These courses are used to determined major GPA, see Graduation Requirements section of the UAFS Undergraduate Academic Catalog. Enrollment in courses beginning with DHYG prefix requires admissions to the dental hygiene program.

Prior to graduation, students must demonstrate competency in financial literacy by satisfactory completion of FIN 1521 Personal Finance Applications (or an approved substitution) with a grade of "C" or better, or by score of 70% or more on a challenge exam for FIN 1521.
